



SLIP CLAY AND TBUCKK

Slip Clay and TBuckk were hired as a songwriting team by the City of Dallas Artist and Residence Program to perform their original songs at VIP events, live radio and television programs, festivals, schools, hospitals, and even correctional facilities. As a team they wrote and performed songs that were published in a major film release, used in advertising jingles, a Texas music CD compilation, children's musicals, and penned the "Art is for Everyone" song for the State of Texas. TBuckk later became the "first" official artist for the State of Texas and was the lead actor in several advertising projects aired around the State called "Art the Zen Mechanic." Slip Clay co-wrote "St. Peter Have Mercy" with TBuckk on the "Don't Mess With Texas Music" CD and also wrote the song "IRS is COD" that is performed by Ronnie Dawson.



STEVIE RAY VAUGHN

Stevie Ray Vaughn began his career as a bass player in Dallas. After gaining popularity from the release of his 1983 debut, "Texas Flood," he quickly rose to fame, sharing the stage with the likes of Eric Clapton, Jeff Beck and Buddy Guy. Vaughn is a four-time W.C. Handy Award winner and a six-time Grammy winner, including *Best Traditional Blues Recording* for "Flood Down in Texas" in 1984, and *Best Rock Instrumental* for "Say What!" in 1987. In 1990, he lost his life in a tragic helicopter crash following a gig, but his legacy lives on, influencing many rock and blues artists nationwide.



PATRICIA VONNE

San Antonio-born singer-songwriter Patricia Vonne made a name for herself on the Austin, music scene with her dramatic marriage of epic ranchero ballads and fiery rock and roll. Before long she was opening shows for several of her musical heroes, including Joe Ely, Alejandro Escovedo, The Cruzados and Los Lobos. In February 2002, Vonne joined Tito and Tarantula, a Latin rock band from Los Angeles, for their European tour of France, Germany, Switzerland, Austria and Italy. Her latest CD, "Patricia Vonne" on Bandolera Records is a bilingual tour-de-force, and has quickly captured critical acclaim across the country.
